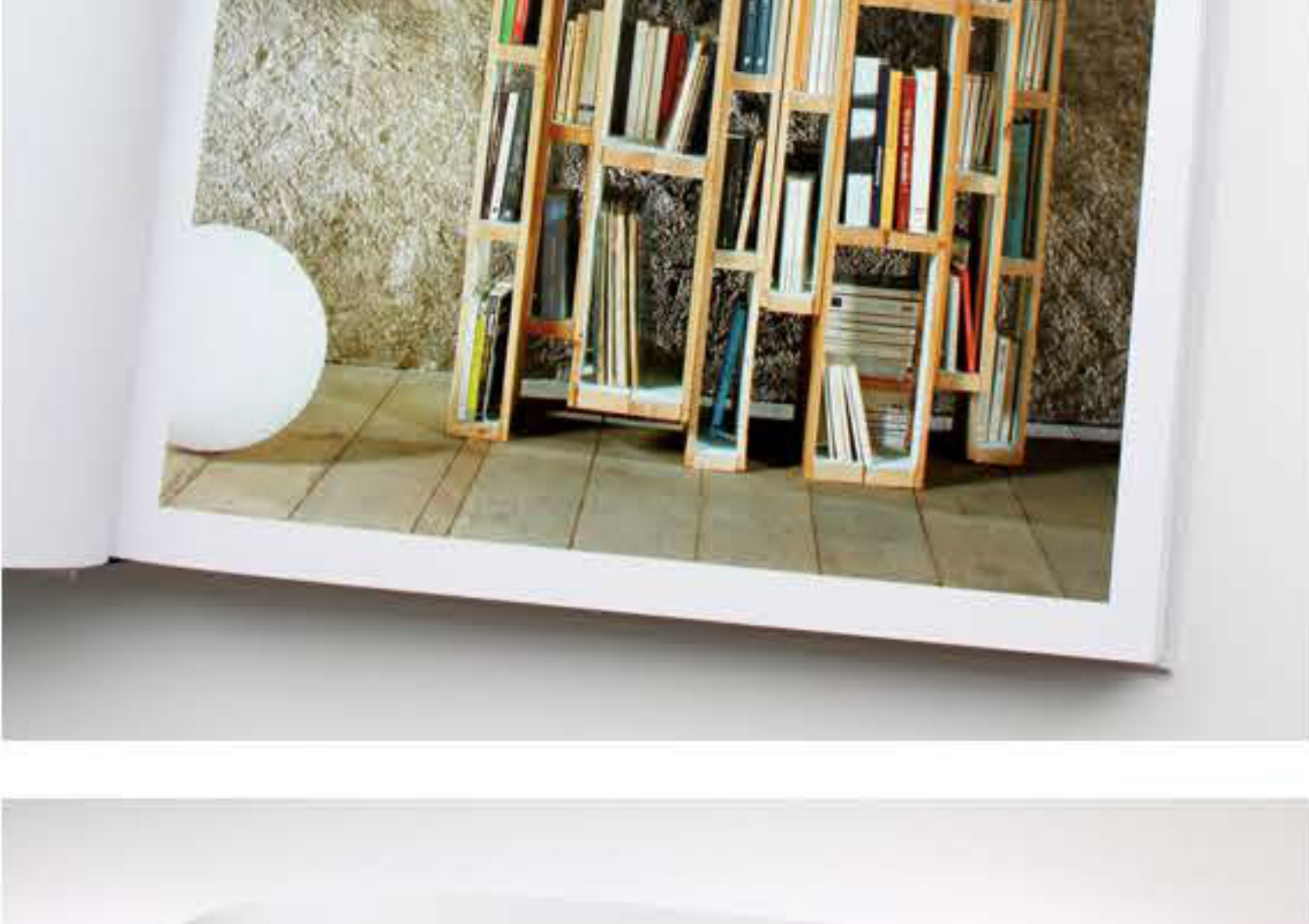


With Upcyclist, the focus is not only on sustainability and creativity, but also on the way in which the results show us objects in a new, unfamiliar context. This is how Stuart Haygarth builds chandeliers from countless old sunglasses, at the studio Bomdesign, finished books are converted into lamps and Yesterday Reclaimed is carving for example benches.



This now sounds terribly complicated and elaborate, but also without tools and welding skills one can look at Upcyclist small ideas. The chapters are sorted according to the respective, processed materials Wood, Textiles, Metal, Glass and Ceramics, Paper and Plastic and Mixed Media. My upcyclist favorites are, by the way, the neon-colored tree trunks, which can surely be reproduced with my two left hands.
